

Unusual Occupations

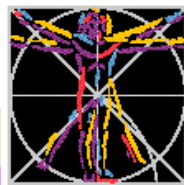
Do you like History or English class? If you do, maybe you've thought of a career using these subjects - beyond being a teacher, historian or writer. Here are some ideas of careers in these fields that are a little beyond the ordinary!

History

Archaeologists examine and recover the ruins of buildings, tools, pottery, and other objects left from past human cultures in to determine the history, customs, and living habits of earlier civilizations.



Archivists collect, organize, and maintain control over a wide range of information important enough for permanent safekeeping. This information includes things like photographs, films, video and sound recordings, computer discs and videotapes, as well as paper records, letters, and documents.



Curators manage museums, zoos, aquariums, botanical gardens, nature centers, and historic sites. They direct the acquisition, storage, and exhibition of collections, including negotiating and authorizing the purchase, sale, exchange, or loan of collections. They are also responsible for authenticating, evaluating, and categorizing the specimens in a collection. Curators manage research projects and educational programs.

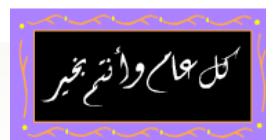
English

Librarians assist people in finding information for personal and professional purposes. Librarians have knowledge of a wide variety of information sources oversee the selection and organization of library materials.

Conservators manage, preserve, and document works of art, artifacts, and specimens—work that may require a lot of historical, scientific, and archaeological research. Conservators document their findings and treat items to minimize their deterioration or to restore them to their original state.



Interpreters convert one spoken language into another—or, in the case of sign-language interpreters, between spoken communication and sign language. **Translators** convert written materials from one language into another. They have excellent writing and analytical abilities.

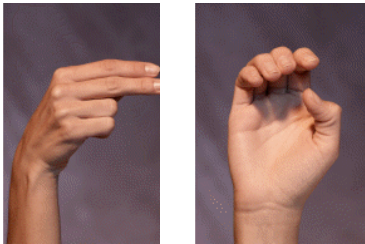

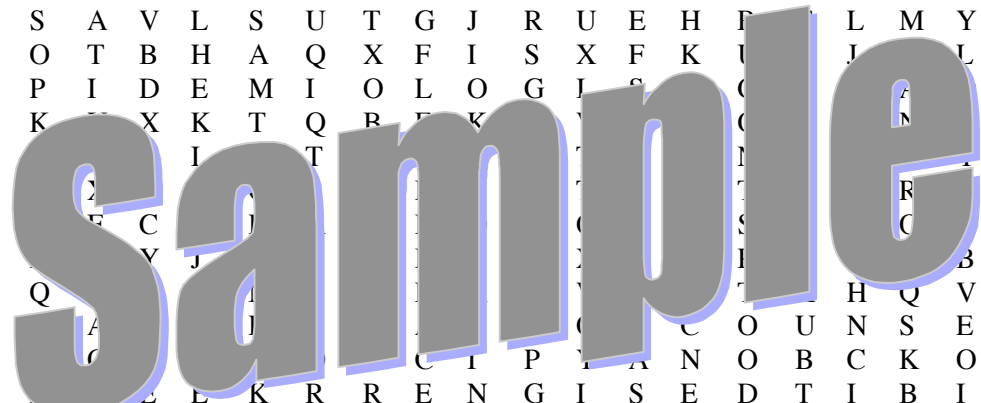
Like history and English, most school subjects lead to typical occupations but, again, there are many jobs out there that are out of the ordinary. Explore your options!
